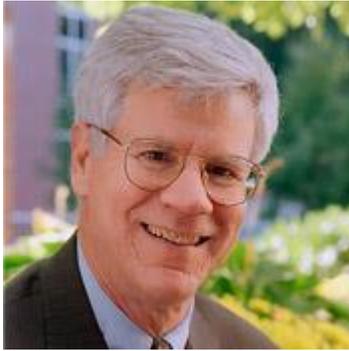

The Nexus of IT Forces: Explosive New Capacity Requires New Strategic Decisions

Dr. Jerry Mechling, Gartner



PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: Moore's Law continues to double the productivity of digital processing every 18 months to two years. The recent wave of productivity has been captured as a nexus or coming together of four powerful forces: social, mobile, and big data applications all delivered over the cloud. What's important is not only understanding these developments, but responding in ways that build new business processes and service delivery options. To succeed, governments need stronger than ever relationships between the technology community – CIOs, their staff, and technology suppliers – AND the department heads, budget directors, and elected officials responsible for program and policy management.

BIO: Jerry Mechling is a vice president at Gartner Research, focusing domestically and internationally on helping governments and their corporate and nonprofit partners with issues of strategic planning, work process innovation and implementation, governance, and information management and analysis.

Dr. Mechling is also a recently retired lecturer in public policy at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government, where he has written "Eight Imperatives for Leaders in a Networked World" – a series of policy papers for the Harvard Policy Group on Network-Enabled Services and Government – and "Finding and Funding IT Initiatives in the Public Sector."

Prior to joining Gartner Research, Dr. Mechling pursued issues of technology-enabled innovation as a researcher, analyst, professor, public speaker, consultant and manager. In 1987, he founded and directed the Harvard Kennedy School's Strategic Computing program (subsequently named the Leadership for a Networked World program). Prior to that, he was director of the office of management and budget for the City of Boston, and then assistant to the mayor and assistant administrator for environmental protection for the City of New York. Dr. Mechling has organized over 100 workshops for public- and private-sector institutions on technology leadership issues and has also been a popular keynote speaker at conferences throughout the U.S. and Canada as well as in Latin America, the Caribbean, Europe, the Middle East and Asia.

Understanding the Security Threats Your Organization Faces

Jim Stickle, TraceSecurity



PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: Over the past 20 years, Stickle has physically robbed over 1000 financial institutions, broken into government facilities and hacked his way into hundreds of organizations networks throughout the United States giving him access to billions of dollars. Fortunately, Stickle is not a criminal, he's hired to test the security of some of the largest organizations in the world. In this session you will learn how technology and social engineering are allowing criminals to gain access to your organizations most confidential information. Using real world examples, Stickle will demonstrate how he does it and what you can do to prevent your office from falling victim to similar attacks.

BIO: Jim Stickle – co-founder of TraceSecurity – has stolen credit cards, hacked Social Security numbers and robbed banks. He has broken into armed government facilities and has stolen from teenagers. He is an identity thief, but he is no criminal. Fortunately for all victims involved, Stickle is a cyber security expert who was hired to perform these attacks by corporations testing their security, news agencies investigating security concerns and other media outlets interested in knowing just how easy it is to commit identity theft. His job is to find security flaws before the real criminals find them and warn people and organizations about what they can do to protect themselves. Stickle has performed such security services for financial institutions, Fortune 100 corporations, healthcare facilities, legal firms and insurance companies, and in doing so, has discovered numerous security vulnerabilities in products such as firewalls, PKI servers, online banking applications and PDA devices.

Stickle is the published author of "The Truth about Identity Theft" and co-author of "Beautiful Security," and has been featured in numerous magazines and newspapers including Time Magazine, Business Week, Fortune Magazine, New York Times, PC Magazine, CSO Magazine among others. He has also been a consultant for Fox News, CBS, NBC and the Associated Press and has been showcased on a number of television shows including NBC's "Nightly News", CNN's "NewsNight", CNBC's "The Big Idea", Anderson Cooper's "Anderson" and is a frequent guest on NBC's "Today Show".

Stickle can be seen throughout the United States where he serves as an entertaining speaker for corporations, security-related conferences, seminars and forums, covering topics that range from basic identity theft to national cyber terrorism.

This presentation will also provide a few mitigation steps, as well as an overview of the services provided by the MS-ISAC to state and local governments.

BIO: Shehzad Mirza is currently working as the Director of the Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center's (MS-ISAC) Security Operations Center (SOC), where he is responsible for managing a team of analysts. Previously, he has worked as a principal consultant with Symantec Corporation managing various cyber security projects, and a technical trainer for New Horizons Computer Learning Center. Shehzad has worked in the security field for over ten years and holds a number of professional certifications including; Microsoft Certified Solutions Expert (MCSE), Global Information Assurance Certification (GCIH) and Certified Information Systems Security Professional (CISSP) certifications. His main expertise is in network security infrastructure and assessment, firewall configuration, intrusion detection system (IDS) and intrusion prevention systems (IPS) configuration, PCI compliance, staffing and vulnerability assessments.

Hire, Retain and Instill Accountability in the Workforce Using Emotional Intelligence

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: Selecting the right person for the job has never been more important than it is today. Mistakes are costly. Put another way, the wrong person earning \$50,000 will cost your company \$125,000. The wrong executive making \$100,000 will cost a quarter of a million dollars IF you rectify the mistake within six months!

How do we find the right person for the job? Employ behavior based interviewing, focusing on more than skill sets. IQ + EQ = the right person! Job fit is “the degree to which a person’s cognitive abilities, interests and personality dynamics fit those required by the job.”

Attract them, hire them and retain them through setting expectations and measuring them = accountability!

BIO: Ingrid Tugwell has served as president and CEO of Productivity Solutions and Training, Inc. (PST) since 1994, where she specializes in delivering professional development seminars throughout the United States. In doing so, she has worked extensively with various branches of the military to deliver training programs dating back to 1991. Prior to entering the training industry, Ingrid worked in the public relations department of the MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas.

Ingrid attended the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colo. and holds several Microsoft, CompTia and Lotus certifications. In fact, she is one of only five Microsoft Master Instructors and IC3 Authorized Instructors in the state of South Carolina. 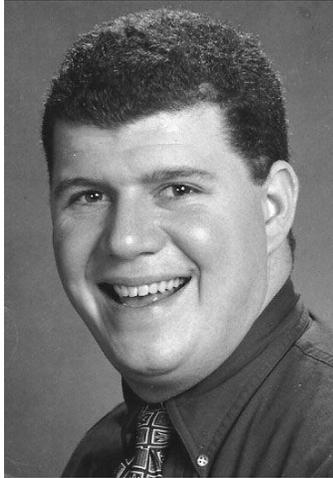
